



Glenthorne Community Primary School Analysis of Sports Premium 2015/2016



Sports Premium Funding

The PE and sport premium is designed to help primary schools improve the quality of the PE and sport activities they offer their pupils.

Initially, the Government committed to spending over £450 million on this funding over the three academic years: 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016. This commitment has now been extended until 2020.

Funding allocations for the academic year 2015 to 2016 are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6, as recorded in the January 2015 census. Pupil Premium Grant Spending 2015/2016

- ◆ Time allocated to the PE Lead to team teach, support and moderate the provision of PE and sports across school.
- ◆ A rigorous sports mentorship programme for staff; to ensure a high quality provision and well developed subject knowledge of colleagues teaching PE.
- ◆ Additional equipment, including club kits for sports, to enable a wider range of sporting activities to be offered beyond the school PE sessions. This will include a sporting disability awareness day.
- ◆ Additional resources purchased to continue the effective running of the 'Healthy Hearts' programme.
- ◆ An agreed amount to fund certificates, rewards and resources for school to school competition programme with local cluster schools.
- ◆ Transport to school sporting events in order to increase participation.
- ◆ Balance bikes and targeted resources for children who need support developing their motor skills, balance or co-ordination.
- ◆ Swimming vouchers provided for those children who need further practice beyond the school curriculum entitlement.
- ◆ Recruit specialist sports coaches to allow children to experience and develop an interest in less common sports.
